A Message for Our Veterans

VA Benefits Increase Effective December 1, 2024

Starting **December 1, 2024**, veterans will see a **2.5% increase** in their VA disability compensation and pension benefits. This adjustment reflects the annual cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) aimed at maintaining the purchasing power of your benefits.

For example, if you currently receive \$1,000 per month, a 2.5% increase will raise your monthly benefit to \$1,025. This increase will be reflected in your December payment, typically received in early January.

If you have questions about how this adjustment affects your specific benefits, please feel free to contact me.

Social Security Changes: Appointment-Based Services

The Social Security Administration is transitioning to an **appointment-based system** to improve efficiency and reduce wait times. By **January 6, 2025**, most services—including requests for Social Security cards—will require appointments.

During the **transition period (now through January 5, 2025)**, walk-ins will still be accepted, especially for urgent or special situations. After January 6, appointments will be the standard, but no one will be turned away if immediate assistance is needed.

This change is meant to streamline your experience and make visits more convenient. If you have questions about this process, don't hesitate to reach out to me.

December: A Time to Review Your Benefits

As the year comes to a close, December is the perfect time to review your VA benefits and ensure you're taking full advantage of the support available to you. Here are a few reminders:

- Annual Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA): Starting December 1, 2024, veterans will see a 2.5% increase in VA disability compensation and pension payments. This increase will be reflected in your January payment.
- VA Health Care Enrollment: If you're not already enrolled, now is a great time to review your eligibility for VA health care services. It's never too late to secure the care you deserve.
- PACT Act Benefits: Veterans exposed to toxic substances during service may qualify for new benefits under the PACT Act. If you think this may apply to you, contact me for more information.

Final Thoughts

As we approach the end of the year, it's a good time to review your benefits and ensure you're receiving all the support you're entitled to. Please reach out if you have any questions or need assistance with your benefits.



Hello Post 57,

November has been a busy month; Veterans Day Celebration, Toys For Tots, and our trip to Orlando for Fall Conference.

Post 57 has taken Care of 8 veterans this month who were in need.

Did you know that going to the VA Hospital and Clinics can cost you Money(Copays)? This month is about Urgent Care.

Urgent care copay rates (Care for minor illnesses and injuries)

There's no limit to how many times you can use urgent care. To be eligible for urgent care benefits, including through our network of approved community providers, both of these must be true:

You must be enrolled in the VA health care system, and

You must have received care from us within the past 24 months (2 years)

If you're only getting a flu shot at your visit, you won't have to pay any copays, no matter your priority group.

Learn more about urgent care benefits

2024 urgent care copay rates

Priority group Copay amount for first 3 visits in each calendar year. Copay amount for each additional visit in the same year:

1 to 5 visits \$0 (no copay) \$30

6 visits If related to a condition that's covered by a special authority: \$0 (no copay)

If not related to a condition covered by a special authority: \$30 each visit \$30

7 to 8 visits \$30 \$30

Note: Special authorities include conditions related to combat service and exposures (like Agent Orange, active duty at Camp Lejeune, ionizing radiation, Project Shipboard Hazard and Defense (SHAD/Project 112), Southwest Asia Conditions) as well as military sexual trauma, and presumptions applicable to certain Veterans with psychosis and other mental illness.
