As we welcome President Donald Trump back to the White House, we are encouraged by the administration's renewed commitment to supporting our nation's veterans. This newsletter highlights recent initiatives and policies designed to enhance the benefits and services available to you.

New Administration's Initiatives Supporting Veterans Reinstatement of Service Members Discharged Over COVID-19 Vaccine Refusal

President Trump has signed an executive order to reinstate over 8,000 service members who were discharged for refusing the COVID-19 vaccine between 2021 and 2023. These individuals will be restored to their previous ranks, receive back pay, and have their benefits reinstated.

What This Means for You:

- If you were discharged under these circumstances, you are eligible for reinstatement and compensation.
- Contact your branch's personnel office or our office for assistance with the reinstatement process.

Appointment of Doug Collins as Secretary of Veterans Affairs

President Trump has nominated former Representative Doug Collins, a Navy veteran and current Air Force Reserve chaplain, to lead the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA). Collins is committed to enhancing veterans' services and ensuring timely access to benefits.

Anticipated Improvements:

- Streamlining the VA claims process to reduce wait times.
- Expanding healthcare services, including mental health support.
- Implementing programs to address veteran homelessness.

Confirmation of Pete Hegseth as Secretary of Defense

Pete Hegseth, an Iraq and Afghanistan war veteran, has been confirmed as Secretary of Defense. He is dedicated to strengthening military readiness and supporting service members and veterans.

Key Initiatives:

- Enhancing support for veterans transitioning to civilian life.
- Focusing on mental health resources for active-duty personnel and veterans.
- · Prioritizing policies that benefit veterans and their families.

Post 57 Buddy Check Program

On March 15th we will be conducting Buddy Checks at Post 57. We need volunteers to aid in our efforts to reach as many Post 57 members as possible. If you are interested, please email the Post Adjutant at post57adjutant@gmail.com or just show up!

As Legionnaires, our most sacred responsibility is to look out for each other and our fellow veterans. The American Legion National Executive Committee passed Resolution 18 during Spring Meetings in May 2019. The resolution called for "Buddy Checks" to be conducted Legion-wide during the weeks of The American Legion's birthday, March 15, and Veterans Day.

More information about the American Legion Buddy Check Program

In the first four years after The American Legion launched Buddy Checks as an official program, more than 1 million veterans have been reached and assisted

The number of local American Legion posts conducting Buddy Check operations in those first four years has grown from 3,683 to 4,456

Buddy Checks are not membership or fundraising calls; they are simple check-ins with veterans in the community to see how they are doing and to learn if the local post can help with anything

The MyLegion.org web platform contains contact information of American Legion members and former members

The Department of Veterans Affairs launched its own National Buddy Check Week in 2023 and invites involvement from local American Legion posts While Buddy Checks can be conducted year round, American Legion posts are strongly encouraged, by resolution, to make Buddy Check calls during Veterans Week (mid-November) and American Legion Birthday Week (mid-March)

Many American Legion posts have assembled Buddy Check teams that make calls monthly or even more frequently

Buddy Check teams are urged to have at their fingertips a list of local resources available if needed. These may be American Legion service officers, Vet Centers, VA health-care facilities, or others who can help

Veterans may be reminded of the 988 Crisis Line in case they know of someone who needs urgent assistance, or if they need it themselves

Hello Post 57,

Cold weather has kept most of us indoors this January.

4 Veterans have been helped this month with Gift cards for food, helping with car repairs, water bills, and phone repairs.

Thank you, to anyone who donates to the VSO account, so that these things can be done for our fellow veterans.

Changes to the GI Bill took effect this month. The following article is from the VA website.

Wilmington , DE — The Department of Veterans Affairs announced that — following the 2024 Supreme Court decision — it has updated the process for awarding GI Bill benefits.

This change means that many Veterans who served multiple periods of military service (for example, Veterans who reenlisted) will be eligible for up to an additional 12 months of education benefits.

Under the previous policy, eligible Veterans who served at least two periods of service were limited to a maximum total of 36 months of GI Bill benefits, between the Montgomery GI Bill and the Post-9/11 GI Bill. Under the updated policy, that limitation is removed — meaning that eligible Veterans can now qualify for up to 48 months of total GI Bill benefits.

This policy change also means that many Veterans who were previously limited to 36 months will now be eligible for additional education benefits. Specifically, Veterans who served at least two qualifying periods of service — one that qualified them for the Montgomery GI Bill and a second that qualified them for the Post-9/11 GI Bill — may be eligible to receive up to 12 months of additional GI Bill benefits (bringing them to a total of 48 months). This could impact as many as 1.04 million Veterans and beneficiaries, and VA is launching a targeted outreach campaign to make sure that every Veteran gets the additional benefits they deserve.

Supporting Veterans and their families is a key pillar of President Biden's Unity Agenda for the nation. VA and the entire Biden-Harris Administration are committed to helping Veterans get the high-quality, low-cost education they deserve. In 2024 alone, VA helped more than 900,000 Veterans or their families pay for school and cover expenses while training for a job. "This policy will not only help Veterans who apply for GI Bill benefits in the future — it will also allow VA to provide additional benefits to many Veterans who used GI Bill benefits in the past," said Under Secretary for Benefits Joshua Jacobs. "Every Veteran has earned the right to get a good, affordable education — and under this new policy, many Veterans will get additional 12 months of GI Bill benefits."

Of the 1.04 million Veterans who may potentially be eligible for an additional 12 months of benefits, VA will be able to automatically adjudicate the claims for approximately 660,000 without any further action required on their part. For all remaining Veterans, VA will be reaching out to them directly to encourage them to file a claim. As a part of this policy, VA is also extending the expiration dates for using GI Bill benefits for eligible Veterans. For each Veteran with multiple periods of service who chose the Post-9/11 GI Bill over the Montgomery GI Bill, VA will reinstate the time they had remaining at the time of their election plus 90 days. For example, if a Veteran chose to use the Post-9/11 GI Bill at a time when they had 5 years left to use the Montgomery GI Bill, they would be given 5 years plus 90 days to use any additional Montgomery GI Bill benefits. To receive an expiration date extension, applications must be submitted by October 1, 2030. Since its inception, the Post-9/11 GI Bill has paid over \$143 billion to over 2.7 million beneficiaries. The GI Bill has long been used as a recruiting and retention tool for the military. It has enabled Veterans and service members — as well as their eligible dependents, through the Department of Defense Transfer of Education Benefits program — to train and attend school while greatly reducing their out-of-pocket costs.
