

### January Highlights

### 1. VA COLA Increase:

Veterans receiving VA disability benefits will see a Cost-of-Living Adjustment (COLA) increase starting this month. This adjustment helps your benefits keep pace with inflation. If you have questions about how this change affects your payments, reach out to me for assistance.

### 2. Service Connection Claims Review:

Start the year by ensuring all your service-connected conditions are accurately documented and rated. If you've experienced new symptoms or worsening conditions, I'm here to help you update your claim and secure the benefits you deserve.

### 3. Secondary Condition Claims:

If you have conditions linked to a service-connected disability, you may be eligible for additional benefits. Let's work together to identify and file claims for these secondary conditions.

- VA Benefits Navigation: Guidance on maximizing your VA benefits and accessing local resources.

Remember, if you have not paid your 2025 dues, as of January 1st, 2025, your membership is no longer valid. You will not be able to attend meetings, social events or visit the lounge, without payment. Some of you will say "Well, I don't have time to volunteer, or come by the post regularly, so why should I continue to pay dues?" The answer is very simple, your membership is very important, as your voice will be heard in Tallahassee and in Congress when The American Legion advocates for Veterans programs and Bills in the House and Senate of both the Federal and State governments. The American legion advocates for all veteran programs. With our Vietnam Vets being of age, and most of our WWII vets already gone, Veteran Programs are going to be impacted if we lose our numbers. December was a very busy month for everyone at Post 57. We only helped one Veteran with gift cards.

January being the start of a New Year, this month's information is on how to check to see if you have a bill and how to pay your bill for the VA.

Review your bills and current balances

Please sign in to review your VA copay balances

Sign in with your existing Login.gov, ID.me, DS Logon, or My HealtheVet account. If you don't have any of these accounts, you can create a free Login.gov or ID.me account now. When you sign in or create an account, you'll be able to:

Review your balances for each of your medical facilities

Download your copay statements

Find the right repayment option for you

Sign in or create an account

Make a payment now

Pay your full balance or request help by the due date on your billing statement to avoid late charges, interest, or collection actions.

You'll need your account number to pay. You can find your account number in our online copay tool or on your billing statement.

### Option 1: Pay online

Pay directly from your bank account or by debit or credit card on the secure Pay.gov website.

Pay your copay bill at Pay.gov

### Option 2: Pay by phone

Call us at 888-827-4817 (TTY: 711). Be sure to have your account number ready.

### Option 3: Pay by mail

Send your payment stub, along with a check or money order made payable to "VA," to this address. Include your account number on the check or money order.

### Option 4: Pay in person

Go to the VA health facility that sent the bill. Ask for the agent cashier's office.

Bring your payment stub, along with a check or money order made payable to "VA." Include your account number on the check or money order.
