
January 24th Roadkill Bingo

What's New at the VA for 2026

Happy New Year! As we welcome 2026, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) continues to build on its commitment to serving America's Veterans with expanded care, benefits, and efficiencies. Here's a look at the key updates and changes taking effect this year.

Increased Disability Compensation with 2.8% COLA Adjustment

One of the most direct impacts for many Veterans will be the annual cost-of-living adjustment (COLA). For 2026, VA disability compensation rates increase by 2.8%, aligned with the Social Security Administration's announcement. This adjustment, effective December 1, 2025, ensures benefits keep pace with inflation.

- The new rates apply automatically—no action is needed from Veterans.
- Payments reflecting the increase appear in January 2026 deposits.
- This boost affects disability compensation, Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC), Special Monthly Compensation (SMC), and other related benefits.

This modest but important raise helps offset rising costs for essentials like housing, food, and healthcare.

Ongoing Implementation of the PACT Act

The Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics (PACT) Act remains a cornerstone of VA expansions. In 2026, Veterans continue to benefit from:

- Presumptive conditions for over 20 illnesses linked to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic exposures.
- Easier access to health care and disability benefits without needing to prove direct causation in many cases.
- Dedicated funding through the Toxic Exposures Fund (TEF), with significant allocations supporting care for exposed Veterans.

The VA encourages all eligible Veterans to undergo toxic exposure screenings, now a standard part of care.
