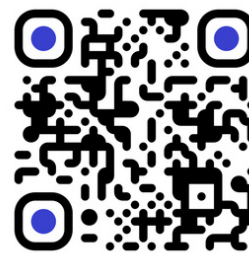

Summer is on the way! May is a time of reflection for all Veterans! Remembering all of those who gave all for this Great Nation!

The Origins of Memorial Day

Memorial Day is a federal holiday observed on the **last Monday in May** to honor the U.S. service members who died while serving in the Armed Forces. In 2026, it falls on **May 25**.

The holiday began after the American Civil War, a conflict that claimed over 600,000 lives. In the war's aftermath, communities in both the North and South started decorating the graves of fallen soldiers with flowers and flags. This practice led to the original name: **Decoration Day**.

On May 5, 1868, Major General John A. Logan, head of the Grand Army of the Republic, issued an order designating **May 30, 1868**, as a national day of remembrance. The first major observance took place at Arlington National Cemetery, where thousands decorated the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers.

Originally focused on Civil War dead, the holiday expanded after World War I to honor all Americans who died in military service. The name "Memorial Day" became official, and in 1971, Congress moved it to the last Monday in May to create a three-day weekend.

Today, Memorial Day remains a solemn occasion for remembrance, marked by cemetery visits, parades, moments of silence, and flags flown at half-staff. It serves as a reminder of the sacrifices made for the nation's freedom.

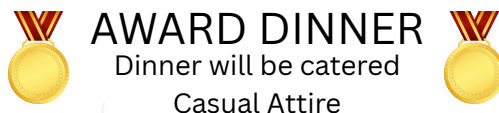

Sea Cadets

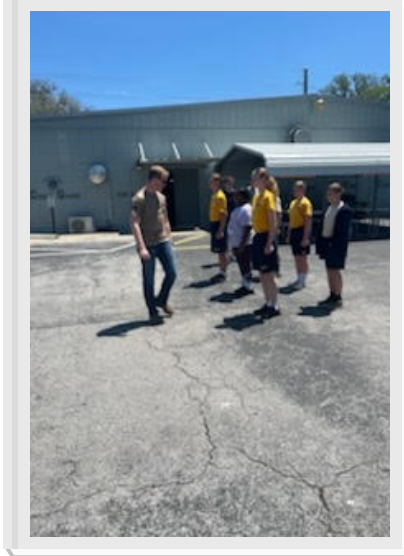
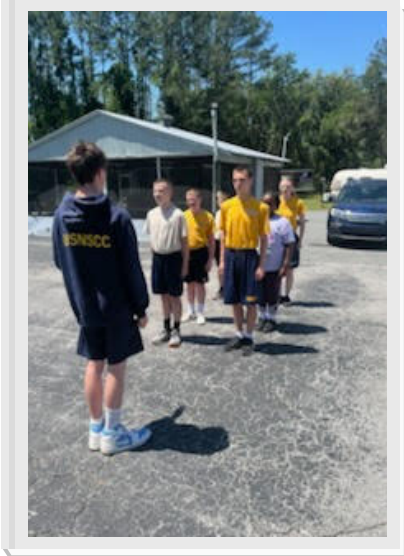
