

Hello 57,

Am I eligible for Commissary and Exchange Privileges?

I hear this question often, the answer is often yes.

In the US, if you are a veteran or service member and one of these must be true. You:

Have a service-connected disability rating and were honorably discharged, or Are retired from military service, or Are a former prisoner of war, or Are a member of the Reserves, or Have received a Purple Heart or the Medal of honor.

You must have the right kind of ID at check out. You can use your VA ID, that has your service connected Disability on it. You can also use a letter from the VA, along with a Driver's license or a Passport.

I hope this helps answer at least one of the many questions we all have as Veterans.

This past month I have had the pleasure of helping 4 Veterans.

Please feel free to ask me any question that you might have, I do not always have the answer but I will do the research to get you an answer.
